



SUICIDE PREVENTION

WARNING SIGNS

- Talking about wanting to die or kill oneself.
- Talking about feeling hopeless or having no reason to live.
- Talking about feeling trapped or not knowing a way out of current situation.
- Talking about being a burden to others.
- Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs.
- Acting anxious or agitated; behaving recklessly.
- Sleeping too much or too little.
- Withdrawing or feeling isolated.
- Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge.
- Displaying extreme mood swings.

WHAT TO DO

- Recognize distress and warning signs
- Ask open-ended questions
- Lend support, listen, and share your concern
- Do not leave the Marine or Sailor alone
- Seek help right away
- Most importantly if you have any concern, **TAKE ACTION!** You may not get a second chance to save a life.
